15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Nanda Nath Saikia College, Titabar, has consistently strived to adopt a multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary approach for the benefit of its students and to fulfill the mission and vision of the institution. To this end, the college has integrated a variety of multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary courses into its academic curriculum, including subjects such as tourism development, web designing, environmental studies, gender studies, entrepreneurship development, and human rights. The implementation of NEP 2020 has mandated the introduction of a number of multidisciplinary courses such as skill enhancement courses, Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC), Gender studies, climate studies, plant diversity and human welfare, natural resource management etc. The college is committed to expanding students' educational experiences beyond the prescribed university curriculum, encouraging them to engage in multidisciplinary activities through various co-curricular initiatives and add-on courses. The college carefully selects papers and subjects to incorporate a multidisciplinary approach, which is further enhanced by the current NEP 2020 framework that allows students to choose subjects from various disciplines and work on interdisciplinary projects. Students are encouraged to participate in intra-college activities, collaborating across subjects in teams and units. Additionally, the institution supports students through various cells like the NSS and NCC, motivating them to actively engage in community outreach initiatives. These activities take place in nearby schools and adopted villages, where students share knowledge and raise awareness on critical issues such as gender equality, women's empowerment, education, health and hygiene, sustainable natural resource management, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, ICT development, life skills, and management skills. The college emphasizes experiential learning through methods like fieldwork, projects, and extension activities, providing students with opportunities to engage with real-world challenges and scenarios.

16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Nanda Nath Saikia College is an affiliated institution under Dibrugarh University, and as such, it adheres to the academic rules and regulations set by the university, always with a focus on the wellbeing of its students. The college has adopted the system of

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) as mandated by the National Education Policy (NEP). The institution is hopeful that the ABC would facilitate in providing more opportunities to students in carrying their academic career forward and to accumulate, transfer, and recognize the credits earned by them throughout their academic journey. Additionally, Skill Enhancement Courses are an integral part of the NEP curriculum, and the college has implemented measures to ensure students make the most of these opportunities. The college's NSS and NCC units also play a key role, providing students with opportunities to engage with the broader community and contribute to societal development.

Nanda Nath Saikia College has effectively implemented the NEP curriculum, allowing students to benefit from a wide range of classical and cultural texts included in the syllabi. The college adopts a bilingual teaching approach, with instructors using both Assamese and English as mediums of instruction. The course content includes classical literary works, such as The Mahabharata, as well as cultural texts like Parijata Harana. The college provides students with platforms to showcase their cultural talents through competitive programs, where they learn various folk music and dance forms, poetry recitation, and more. Additionally, the college offers an add-on course in Yoga to emphasize the significance of this ancient discipline. The college also maintains a collection of medicinal plants, fostering an appreciation for nature and highlighting the potential of alternative Ayurvedic medicine. Furthermore, the college boasts a well-equipped library that offers access to valuable books in vernacular Indian languages and e-resources, supporting modern learning methods. Through these initiatives, the college has taken significant steps toward integrating the Indian Knowledge System, a crucial aspect of the National Education Policy (NEP).

The members of Nanda Nath Saikia College are committed to providing outcome-based education. To stay updated on the latest trends in teaching and learning, the faculty regularly participate in refresher programs, short-term courses, and faculty development workshops. The college supports students in selecting subjects that align with their interests while helping them develop and refine their skills, ensuring they gain comprehensive knowledge by the end of their courses. Orientation programs are held at the start of each session to familiarize students with the range of courses available. Teachers are dedicated to preparing effective teaching and learning materials, utilizing ICT-enabled classrooms, and incorporating PowerPoint presentations, audio-visual tools, and PDF study resources to engage students more deeply in their learning. Additionally, students from various departments participate in field visits, providing them with practical knowledge and a deeper understanding of their respective disciplines. The course outcomes for various programs are made available on the college website, ensuring transparency and easy access for students.

20.Distance education/online education:

Nanda Nath Saikia College currently hosts a center for distance education under Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University. This center offers undergraduate and postgraduate courses in Assamese and English. The college provides students with all necessary texts and study materials and conducts regular through ICT based tools. The college uses several platforms for online classes, including Google Classroom, Cisco WebEx, Google Meet, Zoom, and Teachmint. In addition, a variety of online learning resources have been made available on YouTube and the college website by the faculty. The college also provides students with e-consortium facilities, including access to resources such as Shodh Ganga, Shodh Sindhu, Shodh Suddhi, N-LIST, Infistats, INFED, and e-Pathsala.

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

Nanda Nath Saikia College (established in 1959 and affiliated with Dibrugarh University) follows the university's CBCS-based syllabi and curriculum. The college also offers add-on courses, with syllabi designed by its departments and approved by the university.

Prospectus: An annual prospectus is prepared before admissions, with an e-prospectus introduced in 2023-24.

Academic Calendar: The College develops an academic calendar based on Dibrugarh University's schedule, covering key dates like admissions, examinations, project submissions, and events. It is included in the prospectus and uploaded on the website.

Class Routine: The Academic Planning and Monitoring Board prepare the semester routine, with departments allotting classes to faculty.

Orientation: An orientation program is conducted at the start of each academic session.

Teaching Plan and Syllabus Completion: Faculty must prepare teaching plans and submit syllabus completion certificates at the end of each semester.

Online Classes: Online platforms like Google Meet, Zoom, and others were used during the pandemic, with some teachers continuing online sessions post-pandemic.

Tutorial and Remedial Classes: Extra classes are provided for slow learners to enhance their understanding.

Monitoring and Mentoring: Teachers monitor student progress through tests, seminars, and assignments and guide them under a mentor-mentee system, providing academic and personal support.

Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA): An Examination Committee ensures smooth conduct of sessional and end-semester exams per the university's schedule.

Feedback: A scientific feedback system collects inputs from students, faculty, guardians, alumni, and employers for continuous improvement.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

To assess the learning level of students, departments usually organised class test, seminars, Group discussions, Quizes and active interaction with the students. Sessional examinations are conducted to access the performance of the students. Students having slow learning ability are identified through quiz, class test and sessional examination and therefore give personal interest, providing study materials, notes, remedial classes has been provided by respective teachers. More counselling is given for advancing their learning ability. Moreover special guidance by mentors is provided to the slow learners. All the teachers keep contact with them by which they discuss any queries facing by them

For advanced learners, teachers provide numerous books and advanced study materials, referred journals and sometimes introduce them to reputed subject experts for further special guidance in the areas of their interest. The bright students of a few subjects are taken to the advanced study centers and research centers for better exposure in the concerned subjects. Further departments also invite subject experts to deliver special lectures and encouraged students to undertake research based projects, seminar presentation etc. Apart from these, they are given assignment on current topics; assigning some team work, give information for higher studies and provide counselling for competitive examinations. Students are encouraged to present papers in the seminars held in our college and at other institutions.

Since Nanda Nath Saikia College is an affiliating college, external assessment has not been under its purview. As far as the internal assessment is concerned, the college adopts a crystal clear policy.

TRANSPARENCY OF INTERNAL EXAMINATION:

A) Internal Examination Committee: At the beginning of every academic session, the academic committee appoints an Internal Examination Committee headed by the Vice Principal to conduct internal examinations. The Internal Examination Committee is given in charge of setting up the dates of the examination.

B) Decentralization of Examination: The departments are entrusted with preparing question papers and appointing invigilators for the examinations. The dates of internal exams are notified in the central and departmental notice boards in the college as well as their WhatsApp Groups.

C) Evaluation: The answer scripts are evaluated within 15 days of the date of examination. The marks are notified in the notice boards and WhatsApp groups. The answer scripts are handed over to the students so that they can take note of the remarks written by the concerned teachers for further improvement.

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college has 26 numbers of classrooms with adequate teaching-learning facilities. All the classrooms are equipped with blackboards/ whiteboards. Six numbers of classrooms among them have smart boards with uninterrupted power supply. All the classrooms are well furnished with comfortable and good quality desk- bench and in some of class rooms there are provisions of table- chair for the students. The classrooms are spacious and

there are sufficient numbers of electrical fans and lights in each room.

The departments of Botany, Chemistry, Education, Geography, Mathematics, Physics and Zoology have facilities of laboratories (details enclosed). All the laboratories are well equipped and updated as the requirements of the respective departments. All the laboratories have provisions for conducting classes at the time of requirement. One each of the laboratories of the departments of Botany, Chemistry, Geography, Physics and Zoology has LCD projectors.

For cultural activities, there is an auditorium in the college with more than 600 sitting capacity. The stage of the auditorium is big enough to perform drama, group dance and other cultural programmes. There is a well maintained playground in the college which facilitate various outdoor sports, athletics events, etc. The measurement of the playground is 127mX55m. in the north-western corner of the playground, there is a multipurpose synthetic Volleyball court with tow numbers of Badminton Courts. Facilities for various light indoor games, like, Carom, Chess, Chinese checker, etc. are available in the girls' hostel and boys' and girls' common rooms. For practicing and performing athletics, football, cricket, etc., the college playground is used and adequate accessories are available in the college. Maximum value for response is 4 and the lowest value is 0. Thus, the values obtained by individual teachers are analysed by IQAC along with Feedback Committee and the overall report is submitted to the Principal who takes specific measures to curb any anomaly if found.

Teachers' performance for promotions are also assessed on the basis of their Annual Performance Index in three categories- Category-I: Teaching, Learning and Evaluation Related Activities, Category-II: Co-curricular, Extension, Professional Development related activities and Category-III: Research, Publications and Academic Contributions by the teacher. The minimum API score required for promotion in Category-I is 75 per year, and 15 in Category-II. In Category III, one has to score minimum 5 points annually for promotion from stage I to stage II, 10 points annually for promotion from stage II to stage III and 15 points annually for promotion from stage III to stage IV (Associate Professor).

The conservation and development of the ecosystem are of utmost importance at Nanda Nath Saikia College. The college has implemented a green protocol, which includes a complete ban on the use of plastic within the campus.

The Department of Botany and Department of Zoology have taken various initiatives to raise awareness about environmental issues. The campus hosts a significant number of medicinal herbs and trees, each labeled with name boards to help students and teachers identify and learn about them. To highlight the importance of environmental conservation, significant days such as Ozone Day and World Environment Day are celebrated annually.

Numerous plantation drives have been conducted in and around the campus by the NSS Unit, Teachers' Unit, and various departments, contributing significantly to the greenery of the area. The increase in tree cover has also led to a noticeable growth in the local fauna, promoting biodiversity.

The college operates a vermicompost plant that meets the campus's fertilizer requirements.

As part of its commitment to sustainability, the institution has installed 20KW on-grid and 5KW off-grid solar panels to serve as alternative energy sources. Additionally, the college features a large pond that plays a vital role in enhancing the campus's biodiversity.

Monitoring and Mentoring: Teachers monitor student progress through tests, seminars, and assignments and guide them under a mentor-mentee system, providing academic and personal support.

Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA): An Examination Committee ensures smooth conduct of sessional and end-semester exams per

the university's schedule.

Feedback: A scientific feedback system collects inputs from students, faculty, guardians, alumni, and employers for continuous improvement.

While the university's framework is followed, the principal has the authority to make minor adjustments based on departmental needs, with recommendations from Heads of Departments (HODs).

At the beginning of the session, faculty members are assigned specific subjects, and departments provide students with detailed schedules for examinations and seminars. Attendance is closely monitored, with HODs maintaining records. To enhance learning, departments organize field projects and group discussions. Remedial classes are also conducted to support students requiring extra guidance.

The principal regularly reviews internal assessments to ensure alignment with academic goals. An examination committee oversees the examination process, ensuring timely submission of internal marks by HODs. This structured approach ensures that academic activities, internal assessments, and evaluations are carried out effectively and in line with university guidelines, promoting academic rigor and excellence.

To assess the learning level of students, departments usually organised class test, seminars, Group discussions, Quizes and active interaction with the students. Sessional examinations are conducted to access the performance of the students. Students having slow learning ability are identified through quiz, class test and sessional examination and therefore give personal interest, providing study materials, notes, remedial classes has been provided by respective teachers. More counselling is given for advancing their learning ability. Moreover special guidance by mentors is provided to the slow learners. All the teachers keep contact with them by which they discuss any queries facing by them

For advanced learners, teachers provide numerous books and advanced study materials, referred journals and sometimes introduce them to reputed subject experts for further special guidance in the areas of their interest. The bright students of a few subjects are taken to the advanced study centers and research centers for better exposure in the concerned subjects. Further departments also invite subject experts to deliver special lectures and encouraged students to undertake research based projects, seminar presentation etc. Apart from these, they are given assignment on current topics; assigning some team work, give information for higher studies and provide counselling for competitive examinations. INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college has 26 numbers of classrooms with adequate teaching- learning facilities. All the classrooms are equipped with blackboards/ whiteboards. Six numbers of classrooms among them have smart boards with uninterrupted power supply. All the classrooms are well furnished with comfortable and good quality desk- bench and in some of class rooms there are provisions of table- chair for the students. The classrooms are spacious and there are sufficient numbers of electrical fans and lights in each room.

The departments of Botany, Chemistry, Education, Geography, Mathematics, Physics and Zoology have facilities of laboratories (details enclosed). All the laboratories are well equipped and updated as the requirements of the respective departments. All the laboratories have provisions for conducting classes at the time of requirement. One each of the laboratories of the departments of Botany, Chemistry, Geography, Physics and Zoology has LCD projectors.

Each department of the college has at least one computer for departmental activities like preparing student related documents, question papers, departmental notices, etc. there are facilities of printers in some of the departments which are shared by neighbouring departments, i. e., one printer among 3 or 4 departments.

For cultural activities, there is an auditorium in the college with more than 600 sitting capacity. The stage of the auditorium is big enough to perform drama, group dance and other cultural programmes. There is a well maintained playground in the college which facilitate various outdoor sports, athletics events, etc. The measurement of the playground is 127mX55m. in the north- western corner of the

playground, there is a multipurpose synthetic Volleyball court with tow numbers of Badminton Courts. Facilities for various light indoor games, like, Carom, Chess, Chinese checker, etc. are available in the girls' hostel and boys' and girls' common rooms. For practicing and performing athletics, football, cricket, etc., the college playground is used and adequate accessories are available in the college. There is a gymnasium of 693 square feet in the college. A part time gym instructor is hired to train the students and employees. The number and variety of equipments in the gymnasium is satisfactory. A 6 station multi gym is installed in the gymnasium along with other exercise equipments like Dual Twister, Multifunctional Bench, Manual Roller Jogger, Dumb bells, Squat Rack, Push up Stand, Weight Plates of different weights, etc.

Teachers' performance for promotions are also assessed on the basis of their Annual Performance Index in three categories- Category-I: Teaching, Learning and Evaluation Related Activities, Category-II: Co-curricular, Extension, Professional Development related activities and Category-III: Research, Publications and Academic Contributions by the teacher. The minimum API score required for promotion in Category-I is 75 per year, and 15 in Category-II. In Category III, one has to score minimum 5 points annually for promotion from stage I to stage II, 10 points annually for promotion from stage II to stage III and 15 points annually for promotion from stage III to stage IV (Associate Professor).

Nanda Nath Saikia College, Titabar, places significant emphasis on ensuring and promoting gender equity within its campus. The key measures implemented to promote gender equity are as follows:

Nanda Nath Saikia College has taken proactive steps to create a safe and secure environment for female staff and students. The campus employs dedicated security personnel to monitor visitor entry and exit. Additionally, 24/7 CCTV surveillance ensures continuous monitoring of the campus. The girls' hostel, located within the college premises, is safeguarded with boundary walls and dedicated security staff.

Nanda Nath Saikia College is equipped with essential facilities to support its female stakeholders. The campus includes a well-furnished girls' common room with an attached washroom block. Additionally, there are six toilet blocks designated for female stakeholders. A fully functional Day Care Centre is available to assist female employees with children. The college also provides ramps for differently-abled individuals, along with separate toilet facilities for male and female persons with disabilities (PwD). The college has formalized a policy on Gender Equality and Gender Sensitization to foster an environment of respect and awareness of gender differences. The conservation and development of the ecosystem are of utmost importance at Nanda Nath Saikia College. The college has implemented a green protocol, which includes a complete ban on the use of plastic within the campus.

The Department of Botany and Department of Zoology have taken various initiatives to raise awareness about environmental issues. The campus hosts a significant number of medicinal herbs and trees, each labeled with name boards to help students and teachers identify and learn about them. To highlight the importance of environmental conservation, significant days such as Ozone Day and World Environment Day are celebrated annually.

Numerous plantation drives have been conducted in and around the campus by the NSS Unit, Teachers' Unit, and various departments, contributing significantly to the greenery of the area. The increase in tree cover has also led to a noticeable growth in the local fauna, promoting biodiversity.

The college operates a vermicompost plant that meets the campus's fertilizer requirements.

As part of its commitment to sustainability, the institution has installed 20KW on-grid and 5KW off-grid solar panels to serve as alternative energy sources. Additionally, the college features a large pond that plays a vital role in enhancing the campus's biodiversity.
